**Dear Readers,**

Once again it is time for the newsletter from LiNC (Liverpool international Nordic Community Charity Company) and the Gustaf Adolf Nordic Congregation Company. The summer months are a less hectic time at the Nordic Church, many have holidays in the native countries, others take their breaks locally. The volunteers take time off when the church is closed during part-July and August, to unwind and gather strength for the autumn and winter.

The building has proved to be very popular for music events, there is hardly a week without some evening do, be it gigs or classical concerts. Part of this success is the fantastic sound there is in the church room, every choir singing there comments on it. Why not come and enjoy these events? We profit from it by selling refreshments before and during the events.

When we approached previous choirs in late spring regarding any knowledge about any choirs wanting to come here from Sweden to 'do the Lucia', leaders of one said straight away 'yes please, we loved it when we came in 2012' and they perform again in the cathedral on 12 December. You should know that choir members take time off work and pay for most costs: flights, hotel rooms, etc. We can only offer them a smallish sum, 10 beds and some meals.

So, do come and spend an hour or two listening to the beautiful music and watching the amazing procession in the dark cathedral! And if you miss it, join us at the church the next day for the equally beautiful singing of our parishioners.

If you are member/s of LiNC and/or the Congregation you should mark 15 November down for a visit to church: two AGMs in one go! And if you have not signed up to the charities yet, why not do it on the day? You are most welcome to attend, but with no voting rights at this meeting.

**Report from Roger Metcalf,  
Chairman of the LiNC Charity Company**

The summer is over and we are now preparing for our busiest time of year. I hope you all enjoyed yourselves over the summer, even if the weather was not exactly outstanding. The LiNC charity has been very busy over this period of time. Our wonderful volunteers have continued to keep the church open for our usual activities, coffee mornings, conducted tours, concerts, group activities and of course church services. I thank the volunteers very much for maintaining all this activity over the summer.

As promised in my previous report, we have converted the old sauna room into two new unisex showers and toilets. These new facilities are for the benefit of all our visitors and can be accessed by turning left at the bottom of the entrance stairs. The cost was higher than expected, due to problems we could not have anticipated with the flooring and drains. However, the additional excavation revealed that the lightning conductor from the spire had never been correctly installed, which has now been rectified.

If you have visited the church recently, you will have seen that we have vastly improved the food serving area. This has involved the purchase of three new serving cabinets, all generously paid for by the ladies craft group. We have also purchased a glass-fronted fridge to complete the facility and now store drinks and your favourite cakes in it. The problem with this job was how to remove the old half-size snooker table and for it to go to a good home. I am glad to say that the table became a gift to the Whitechapel Centre and they removed it at no cost to us. A major refurbishment of the coffee room floor was carried out at the same time. Thanks to Mette, Stan, Ole and Sylvia and all the members of the craft group involved in this project. We are also embarking on a new method of preparing the coffee mornings now with a rota of volunteers to staff all the kitchen work involved in this increasingly popular weekly event.

We have been informed that the building work on the development of the Heap's Mill area next to the church may well be starting in the early months of next year. This will include the construction of an eleven story block of flats right beside us on Cornhill Street. It is a major source of concern to us with regard to the safety of our Grade II\* building. I am in contact with the managing director of the architect firm and will develop this contact to the construction engineers when they are known. In the meantime, LiNC has arranged for a new survey of our building to be carried out. This will be reported back to us soon. However, during the initial survey, comment was passed on how good the building looks inside. This is a result of the work carried out and paid for by your support through the charity. I am sure that it will be no surprise to you that the major area of concern for us is the church room itself and the state of the external stone work of the building. I will keep you informed on this matter. We are now starting to get ready for all our special events that lead us up to Christmas.

The Bazaar will be on Saturday 21 November, so volunteers to help will be much appreciated as will any items for sale. Lucia in the Cathedral will be held on Saturday 12 December, and a returning choir will sing for us. 'Till Glädje' visited us in 2012 and the leaders were very happy to return to us and Liverpool Cathedral. Then we will have our own Lucia celebration the day after, on Sunday 13 December, with our own home-grown singers. ## Stan Royden: CHURCH COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT 2015

The Gustaf Adolf Nordic congregation company (for that is what we are) has at present 54 paying members. We are most grateful for their loyal support; without it we would be unable to function as a church, so if you are thinking of becoming a paying member, do have a word with our treasurer Harriet, or any member of the church council (see below).

This has been an interesting year, with visits from all the Nordic countries. Our first pastor-in-charge, Jo Jan Vandenheede, was formally inducted by Bishop Martin Lind on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> April, having been in place since the end of January. As a result, we have had fewer visiting ministers than in previous years, although we are pleased that Kristina Andreasson from the Swedish church in London will be back for Advent Sunday, and also in January for "julgransplundring".

Services have functioned quite well, apart from the monthly family services, which have so far failed to attract many takers. More resources are needed here. We normally have no service on the third Sunday in the month, but have done so twice recently due to visits from choirs from Sweden and Norway respectively. Such visits are very uplifting. We had our harvest festival on Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> September. It was a great success, thanks to a lot of hard work by a few willing helpers, and a large number of items were donated to a local food-bank.

We look forward to hosting the congregation of the German Church on 1<sup>st</sup> November to mark Reformation Day. It is good that these exchanges have now become a tradition. Our Lucia festival on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> December will be attended by our patron, Dame Lorna Muirhead, and her presence always seems to uplift the occasion. No doubt the Lucia choir will be getting into practice again soon.

Jo Jan has worked hard to produce bilingual communion service booklets. The Anglo-Swedish one is already up and running and the Norwegian one will be next. They have provision for sung liturgy, which has been missing for far too long. Jo Jan is mastering the mysteries of Swedish pronunciation – well done!

We have been asked by the Bishop Martin if we are prepared to host the synod next year (probably Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> April). We think it would be quite appropriate and have said yes. Phil Benzie remains our organist and is a model of reliability. We thank him for his musical input every Sunday.

Our musical duo "Nordic Scouse" with Mette on violin and Sylvia on guitar added considerably to the occasion at the Valborg and Midsommer celebrations.

There are always beautiful flowers on the altar and the person who arranges them and puts them there is Mette. Yet another reason to thank her.

Apart from the addition of our pastor, the church council is unchanged from last year: Helen Metcalf (secretary), Harriet Busby (treasurer), Robert Lee, Ulfar Norddahl and Katrine Vik. My thanks to all of them for their commitment and support.

Jo Jan has had some health problems, but he seems to be over them now and keen to continue his ministry among us. The church council has therefore asked the Lutheran Church in Great Britain to extend his contract with us to the end of next year. So we look forward to a second year with a pastor in charge. Let's all work together to make it a successful one!

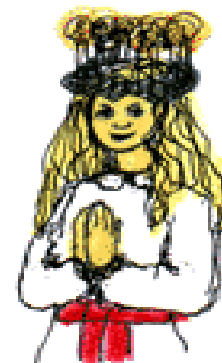

## Terry Ireland: Art and You

Many people love drawing, they doodle as they are on the telephone, they colour in shapes and they remember how, as children, they created vivid colourful illustrations which they presented proudly to their parents with joy. Sadly, life, family, school and the constraints of time and fear donated by impatient art teachers, often make them shy away from sketching or drawing.

There is a good illustration of this fear from a story about Winston Churchill who went on to become a really competent painter:

One day Winston was sitting in his large garden at Blenheim Palace for he had bought expensive oil paints, canvases and a really good quality easel, which he had set up in front of a beautiful red rose bush. Fear had smitten Winston, as he sat with a palette and a brush in hand, loaded with red paint, in front of the white canvas and he was literally paralysed. Just imagine his anger when luckily a young artist, who was a weekend guest, approached, looked at him and the canvas, grabbed his brush covered in red paint and made a great splatter in the middle of the canvas with the words 'Look at that, it is no longer white!'. Winston turned towards him furious, about to erupt as only he could, when he realised what the man meant and a big smile spread across his face. The young artist had made the difficult mark. Asking for his advice, Winston carried on to make his first oil painting, eventually becoming a quite competent oil painter.

Remember when you were a child, uninhibited by any art education, you used crayons and paint to make vivid, bold, colourful, expressive, basic illustrations to express on paper what you observed. Such work captured you in a trance of expression that you often have never experienced since.

Grayson Perry described his art as 'the inner shed where I go to lose myself...' To sit with a sketch pad by a river bank, at the sea's edge or even in a car park, you will find you lose yourself, free from everyday worries, into a different world. You learn by reading the odd book, practise and encouragement from friends, to make quite pleasing attempts to express yourself in lines and colour.

If you join a local art group, you will be welcomed and meet new friends with similar interests, eager to paint or sketch and also eager to help you. Buy a few blank cards and try making individual birthday cards. I am often requested to produce such things at short notice and, as they are delivered by hand, I design my own stamps for the envelope. It was astonishing to learn that a local friend had amassed a collection of some 30 envelopes, he commented 'I love these and they are never the same'. Eventually you may progress to produce a water-colour or an acrylic painting you frame and submit it for an exhibition and be surprised that someone buys it.

The great thing is that art is really enjoyable and everyone has a talent in some measure, even if only to copy an illustration. After all, art is only doodling with real purpose!

### Some items that LiNC has paid for recently:

Sauna conversion to 2 toilets/shower rooms £9900, (part of long-term plans for a lift), lightning conductor £522, heating and boiler repairs £792, replacement dishwasher £2808, glass-fronted fridge £410. The Saturday Craft Group donated £2075 for three new serving units in the coffee room. The money comes from all handicraft items sold by the group and LiNC is very grateful for the donation.

### Hundraåringen som klev ut genom fönstret och försvann

(The 100 Year Old Man Who Climbed Out of the Window and Disappeared)

Felix Herngren, Sweden, 2014

Despite having reached his 100th birthday, Allan Karlsson still has a sharp mind. Keen to avoid his party he climbs out of his bedroom window at his retirement home and begins an escapade which involves crime and many significant world events involving notable international figures.

**Monday 7 December**, 7.45pm: **Sibelius**, Timo Koivusalo, Finland, 2003

The definitive film about the musical and political conflicts in the life of Sibelius from the period of the 1890's from the iconic Finlandia suite through the turmoil of the breakaway from Russia in 1917 and the subsequent battle between the Reds and the Whites leading to Independence and the full flowering of his genius.

**Monday 25 January** 2016, 7.45pm; **Strákarnir okkar** (Eleven Men Out) Róbert I. Douglas, Iceland, 2005

Tracing the story of footballer Ottar Thor who comes out as gay to his teammates and the public. However, his revelation greatly disconcerts others and it isn't long before he is relegated to the club's bench. Deciding that there is no future in his current team he elects to play for a small amateur team where he stars. Now wanted by his previous team, Ottar is now faced with a dilemma – either stay in his new team or return to KR, his previous team, provided he renounces his sexuality.
