2022 AGM Minutes

Minutes from the 2021 AGM Approved and Accepted

Pastor's Report

We have successfully moved from online only to in-person services. However, we continue to provide an alternative for those who are either not able or not comfortable with coming in-person - these are done via Facebook Livestream's instead.

Over the past year we have seen an increase in average attendances at our Sunday services! At present, we have a running attendance of 13 adults and 2 children. We have also gained a number of new members over the past year, and we can't wait to welcome more people over the coming year!

In total we have also had one confirmation, one wedding, and three funerals in the past year. Back in September we had a parish retreat which was a great success. With this in mind, we are hoping to do more this year -there will be 20 available spaces.

As promised, we began our gardening group and as a result they have done some great work over the last year, but we do need more people to help! If this is something that you would be interested in, then please do not hesitate to contact us so we can get you involved also! Furthermore, joint services have been taking place between the English and Polish Congregations on a regular basis over the past year.

Sadly, Pastor Mark stepped down as Pastor-in-Charge of St. Luke's. Joseph has been working hard to ensure that services continue as usual with special thanks to those who have taken services for us, including Pastor Libby, Bishop Walter, Pastor Mark, Joseph, Conrad, and Nev.

Despite stepping down Pastor Mark has stressed that he has not retired from ministry. He has resigned from being Pastor-in-Charge only, and he is looking to work more outside of the Church in a missionary capacity.



Plans for the Coming Year

We have numerous plans for the upcoming year, including:

1. Pastor Mark has returned to 'God's Squad' to assist them during a difficult period. This is occurring as part of his work to be more involved in developing the missions and outreach work of St. Luke's.

- 2. We seek to have another parish retreat this year encouraging as many of you as possible to join us.
- 3. Following a successful parish meal at Ambiente last year, we seek to have more such events. Including a pub social at the end of this month.
- 4. Joseph wants us to have a collaborative form of ministry, where we work together for the Church and seek to work together to move forward in our life as a congregation. He has stressed that 'this is your Church not mine or the parish councils, but something that we all do together'. This year he has also stressed that he wishes to work with members of the parish to look at their vision and plans for the coming years.
- 5. Joseph also wants to meet every member of the congregation for a chat and a cup of tea/coffee (or a beverage of their choosing!) in order to get to know each person better.
- 6. We seek to work more closely with our German colleagues and congregation. To help facilitate this, we will be having a joint Easter Vigil this year.

On a separate note - Joseph announced that he is no longer secretary of the parish or a lay member of the parish council, but he has now joined the clergy section of the parish council. Due to this and the proposal to reduce the number of parish council members, there will be a vacancy for election at this AGM.

Financial Report

Conrad noted how important gift aid is and asked that people consider increasing their donations if they can.

Joseph then thanked Conrad for all of his hard work.

Amalgamation of St. Luke's and St. Matthew's

Proposal from the agenda:

Bishop Walter, Pastor Mark, Pastor Libby, and Joseph propose that we merge the parishes of St. Matthew's and St. Luke's together into one parish and with one parish council whilst maintaining two distinct ministries (both Polish and English ministries continuing). The Name of this new parish would be 'St. Matthew's and St. Luke's'. The first parish council would consist of 3 parish council members from St. Matthew's, plus 3 from St. Luke's (including all local clergy).

Conrad and Charles were elected as members of the parish council last year and therefore will not be up for election this year. We are now looking for one or more members of the congregation (must be a full member of the parish and be confirmed) to stand for election to the parish council.

The parish will seek formally become a charity, it would like permission from the congregation to investigate how St. Luke's, St. Matthew's, and possibly the House Trusts of both churches could potentially be united to better facilitate and finance the work and ministry of the Church.

The Parish council also seeks permission from the congregation to go forward with the proposed plans to unite into one parish. We ask that the congregation approve that the parish council (s) would be allowed to have the freedom to make decisions as to how we go forward with this.

A discussion has been had around the exact name of the congregation - this is to be decided later by the parish council.

Financial and governance questions will also be sorted by the parish council as we progress in the process.

The AGM voted unanimously in favour of the motion to merge the two parishes.

If St. Matthew's does the same, then the amalgamation will take place after the LCiGB Synod in April.

Election

Philip, Theresa, and Robbie stood for election to the space on the Parish Council.

Theresa has been duly elected to the Parish Council. This position is a 1-year appointment.

Joseph thanked Robbie and Philip for standing.

Philip has further been appointed as the new Church Warden.

Letter of Call

The LCiGB requires a 'Letter of Call' for Joseph to be ordained (aiming for the 23rd of April at 3pm, after Synod).

The AGM voted unanimously for Joseph to receive a letter of call from the congregation. Conrad will further assist in drafting this and will send it on to the LCiGB.

<u>Synod</u>

Synod will be on the 23rd of April this year.

We require help with catering, serving tea and coffee, and with certain other roles for the day (along with cakes!).

<u>AOB</u>

Joseph has been thanked for his contribution to St. Luke's over the past year.

Thanks were passed again to Robbie and Philip for their support and participation in the Parish Council election.

The meeting was then closed, and Bishop Walter Led us in prayer.

However, if we look behind the word in the scriptures for 'repent' we see a very different understanding beginning to form. The Greek word often used for repent is 'metanoia'. Metanoia isn't a simple word and isn't a word that means something as basic as our word 'repent' does. Metanoia speaks of the entire transformation of the person, of their mind, heart, life, and outlook. To repent (in the sense of metanoia) is to be completely changed and renewed. When we repent, we bring before God all those areas of our life that need work. The areas that we regret and feel sorrow for. The areas that we don't know what to do with and it is he who makes a difference.

There is a time to sorrow for past sins and to regret mistakes made. Lent is such a season; However, lent is also an opportunity to recognise again the gift of the gospel...



and to seek to enter a new season where we can rejoice in the salvation offered by Jesus. If you would like someone to hear your confession this lent and to proclaim words of forgiveness and absolution over your past please let Pastor Mark, Pastor Libby, Pastor Krystyna, or Bishop Walter Know.

Services in Harrogate


